























# Descendants of Rev. Daniel White and Catharine Campbell


Daniel White (or Whyte), a Baptist preacher, married Catharine Campbell of Argyll in Scotland in August 1806. They sailed for Greenock on the ship *Liberty* on August 28, 1807 and arrived in Charleston, South Carolina on October 7th.<sup>1</sup> Their first

Rev. White preached his first sermon in America at Lumb  
North Carolina on the first Sunday in November 1807. He
